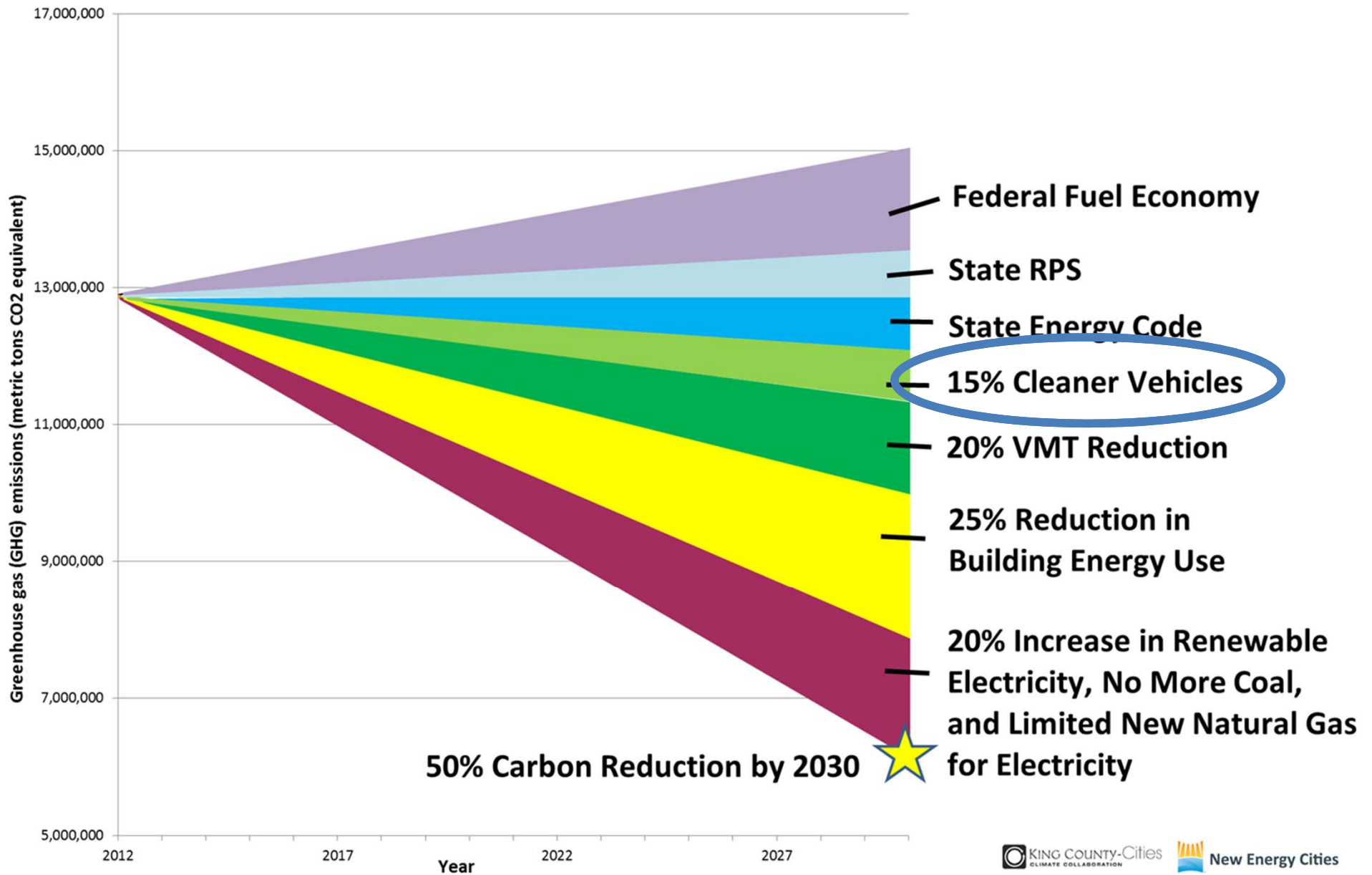

What is the K4C?

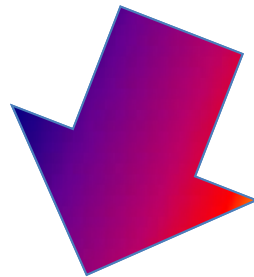


- Coordinates and enhances the effectiveness of local government action on climate change and sustainability
- Formal coalition of King County and 13 cities
- Represents 75% of county's population
- Current sub-committees/work groups:
 - EV Workplace Charging
 - Clean Energy Transition
 - Commercial energy benchmarking
 - Collaborative monitoring/reporting on GHG emissions
 - Solar-related projects in cities

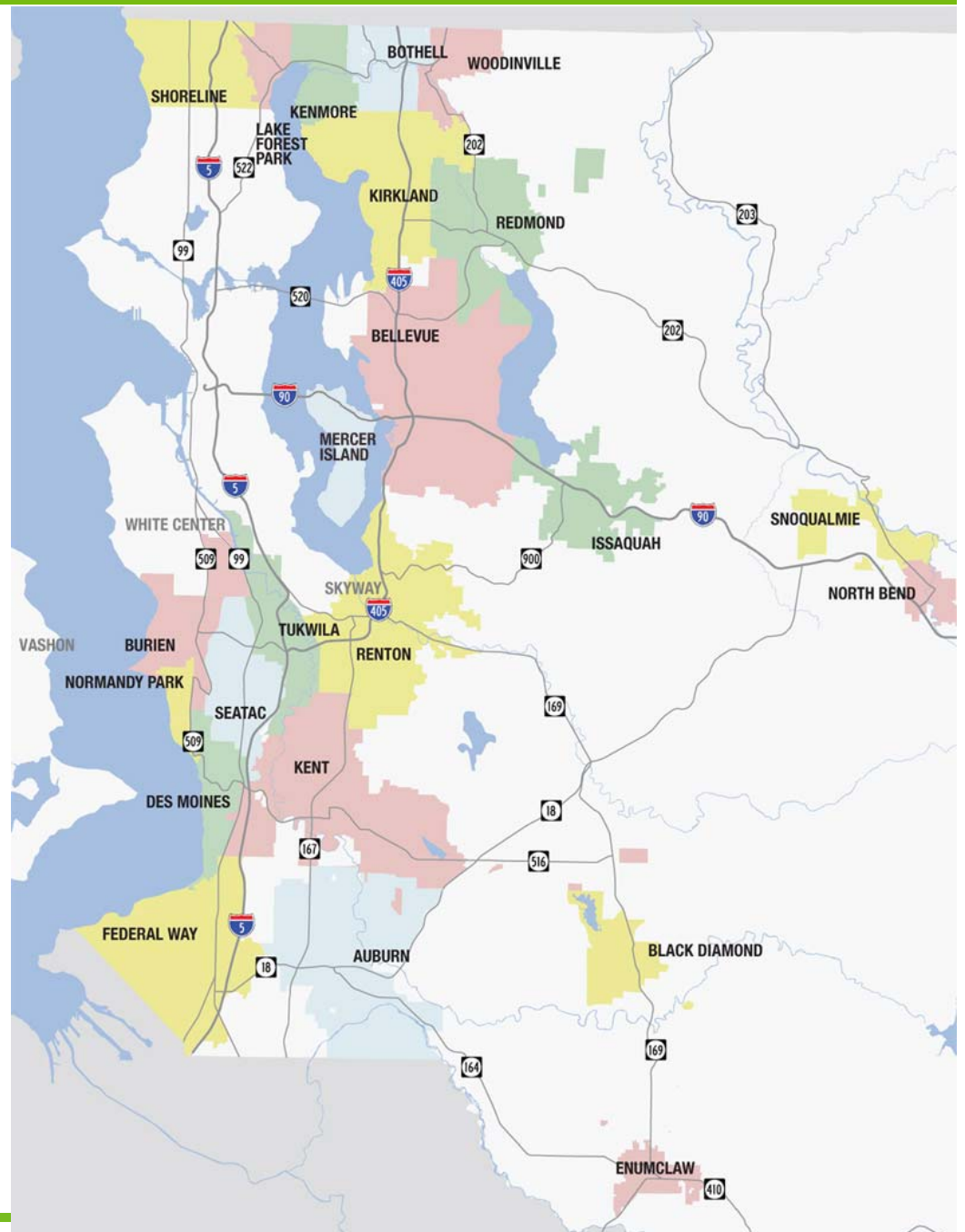
